

Canadian University Shooting Federation 2021-22 Rimfire Precision League Rules

- 1a. Only CUSF members may participate in the League. Competitors must register for the League through the CUSF website.
- 1b. Competitors must register for a Practiscore account in order to participate in sanctioned ORPS events.
- 2a. The league will take place in September 2021, October 2021, November 2021, December 2021, January 2022, February 2022, and March 2022.
- 2b. Monthly events must be shot before 11:59 pm on the last day of the month to be considered eligible for entry as a league score.
- 2c. If local health restrictions related to COVID-19 prevent competitors from shooting in a given month, makeup events may be shot at a later time. Makeup events can occur the same day as another month's event but must be approved in writing by the Programs Director for each club. - 3. The rules of each event will be as described in the matchbook published for each month and as described on the ORPS website (www.outlawrimfire.com)
- 4. Scores will be tracked through Practiscore by ORPS.
- 5. One event will consist of each month's published course of fire on the ORPS website.
- 7. The best 4 out of 7 scores will count towards the final League standings. A minimum of 4 scores must be included to be considered for placement at the end of the league.
- 8. Competitors will be ranked by average hit percentage to the nearest tenth of a percent. Shooters who place in the top 3 when league scores are compiled upon completion of the League will be presented with trophies. If there is a tie for any of the top 3 positions, names will be drawn from a hat to



determine placement. All participants will be eligible for prizes from the CUSF drawn at random when the league is finished. The odds of winning prizes will be based on participation. Each month that a student participates in the League will provide one entry into the grand prize draw. No student can win 2 prizes in the grand prize draw. Competitors are eligible for the first prize they are drawn for and if they are drawn again, another name will be chosen.

Other Prize draws may take place at the sole discretion of the CUSF for those who participate in the league. Entries will be based on the number of events shot in the months before the draw. Each event will be worth one entry. No student can win 2 prizes in the same draw. Competitors are eligible for the first prize they are drawn for and if they are drawn again, another name will be chosen.

Anyone who gets drawn to win a firearm must have a valid PAL. There are no substitutions or exceptions to this rule. If the person drawn does not have a valid PAL, another name will be drawn.
